

Gujarati Grammar - Nouns and Pronouns

Mastering Nouns and Pronouns in Gujarati Grammar

DEFINITION

Nouns are words that name people, places, or things, while pronouns replace nouns to avoid repetition.

KEY CONCEPTS

Nouns

Nouns can be common (general names) or proper (specific names).

Pronouns

Pronouns like 'he', 'she', and 'they' are used instead of nouns.

Types of Nouns

Nouns can be categorized into concrete (physical objects) and abstract (ideas or qualities).

Gender in Nouns

Nouns in Gujarati have gender, which affects the form of adjectives and verbs.

Pronoun Agreement

Pronouns must agree in number and gender with the nouns they replace.

EXAMPLES

- Ram is a boy. He plays.
- The city is beautiful. It has parks.
- The teacher teaches. She is kind.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'Noun = Name' to link nouns with naming.
- ★ Use 'P' in 'Pronoun' to think of 'Replacing' nouns.
- ★ Visualize a gender symbol next to nouns to remember their gender.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Using the wrong pronoun for a noun's gender.
- ✗ Confusing singular and plural forms of nouns.
- ✗ Forgetting to capitalize proper nouns.
