Mastering Literary Devices in Gujarati Literature

DEFINITION

Literary devices are techniques used by writers to enhance their storytelling and express ideas. They help create deeper meanings and engage readers.

KEY CONCEPTS

Simile

A comparison between two different things using 'like' or 'as' to highlight similarities.

Metaphor

A direct comparison between two unlike things, suggesting they are the same in a meaningful way.

Alliteration

The repetition of the same initial consonant sound in a series of words to create rhythm.

Personification

Giving human traits or emotions to non-human objects or abstract concepts.

Hyperbole

An exaggerated statement not meant to be taken literally, used for emphasis.

EXAMPLES

- Her smile was as bright as the sun.
- Time is a thief that steals our moments.
- The wind whispered through the trees.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'Silly Monkeys Always Play Hopscotch' for Simile, Metaphor, Alliteration, Personification, Hyperbole.
- ★ Visualize a story where each character represents a literary device.
- ★ Create a rhyme or song using examples of each device.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing similes with metaphors.
- ✗ Using hyperbole too frequently, making it lose impact.
- ✗ Neglecting to explain the significance of the device in analysis.
