Understanding the Foundations of Political Theory

DEFINITION

Political theory explores the ideas and principles that shape political systems and governance. It helps us understand concepts like justice, power, and rights.

KEY CONCEPTS

Justice

Justice refers to fairness in the distribution of resources and opportunities within a society.

Power

Power is the ability to influence or control the behavior of people and institutions.

Rights

Rights are entitlements that individuals have, which protect their freedoms and ensure their dignity.

Democracy

Democracy is a system of government where citizens exercise power, typically through elected representatives.

Liberty

Liberty refers to the freedom individuals have to act according to their own will, within the law.

EXAMPLES
