DEFINITION

संस्कृत अक्षरमाला मूल means 'We are reading the alphabet.' It introduces students to the basic letters of the Sanskrit language.

KEY CONCEPTS

Sanskrit Letters

The Sanskrit alphabet consists of vowels and consonants that form the foundation of the language.

Consonants

There are 33 consonants in Sanskrit, which combine with vowels to create syllables.

Writing Practice

Practicing writing the letters helps in memorizing their shapes and sounds.

Vowels

Sanskrit has 14 vowels, each with a unique sound and symbol.

Pronunciation

Correct pronunciation is essential for clarity and understanding in Sanskrit.

EXAMPLES

- अ, इ, उ, ए are the first four vowels.
- क, ख, ग, घ are the first four consonants.
- Combining vowels and consonants forms words like 'किताब' (book).

- ★ Use flashcards with letters and sounds for quick recall.
- ★ Create a song or rhyme using the letters to make learning fun.
- ★ Group similar letters together to remember them easily.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing similar-looking letters like क and ख.
- ✗ Mispronouncing vowels due to lack of practice.
- ✗ Skipping writing practice, which aids memory.
