DEFINITION

Science is the study of the natural world through observation and experimentation. It helps us understand how things work around us.

KEY CONCEPTS

Scientific Method

A systematic approach to problem-solving that includes observation, hypothesis, experimentation, and conclusion.

Matter

Anything that has mass and takes up space, including solids, liquids, and gases.

Energy

The ability to do work or cause change, existing in various forms like heat, light, and motion.

Ecosystem

A community of living organisms interacting with their environment, including both biotic and abiotic factors.

Forces

Pushes or pulls that can change the motion of an object, including gravity and friction.

EXAMPLES

- Mixing vinegar and baking soda to create a chemical reaction.
- Observing plants and animals in a local park to study ecosystems.
- Using a rubber band to demonstrate potential and kinetic energy.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'SHEEP' for Scientific Method: State, Hypothesize, Experiment, Evaluate, Present.
- ★ Use 'MELT' for states of matter: Matter, Energy, Liquid, Solid, Gas.
- ★ Think of 'FINE' for types of forces: Friction, Inertia, Normal, and Elastic.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing mass with weight; mass is the amount of matter, weight is the force of gravity on it.
- ✗ Forgetting to include all variables in an experiment, which can lead to inaccurate results.
- ✗ Neglecting to observe safety rules during experiments, which can cause accidents.
