

Numbers and Numeration

Understanding Numbers and Their Place Values

DEFINITION

Numbers are symbols used to represent quantities. Numeration is the system of counting and understanding these numbers.

KEY CONCEPTS

Place Value

Place value shows the value of a digit based on its position in a number.

Whole Numbers

Whole numbers are non-negative numbers without fractions or decimals, starting from zero.

Comparing Numbers

Comparing numbers involves determining which number is larger, smaller, or equal.

Number Line

A number line is a visual representation of numbers in order, showing their relative positions.

Even and Odd Numbers

Even numbers can be divided by 2 without a remainder, while odd numbers cannot.

EXAMPLES

- The number 345 has 3 in the hundreds place.
- On a number line, 7 is to the right of 5.
- 4 is an even number, while 3 is odd.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'Every Other' for even and odd numbers.
- ★ Use the acronym 'PEN' for Place value, Even/Odd, Number line.
- ★ Visualize a number line as a ruler to understand number positions.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing place values, like mixing up tens and hundreds.
- ✗ Misidentifying even and odd numbers.
- ✗ Forgetting to align numbers correctly when comparing.
