DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Characteristics of Life

Cell Theory states that all living organisms are composed of cells, which are the basic units of life.

- ★ Visualize a tree to represent Biodiversity, with branches as different species.

- ✗ Confusing characteristics of living and non-living things.
- ✗ Overlooking the importance of ecosystems in biodiversity.
- ✗ Misunderstanding the levels of classification in taxonomy.
