DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Theme Identification

Literary Devices

Contextual Understanding

Critical Thinking

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Overlooking the author's purpose when analyzing a text.
- ✗ Failing to support interpretations with evidence from the text.
