DEFINITION

Some Basic Concepts of Chemistry focuses on the fundamental principles that govern chemical reactions and the behavior of matter.

KEY CONCEPTS

Mole Concept

The mole is a unit that measures the amount of substance, defined as 6.022×10^{23} particles.

Molar Mass

Molar mass is the mass of one mole of a substance, expressed in grams per mole (g/mol).

Stoichiometry

Stoichiometry involves calculating the quantities of reactants and products in chemical reactions.

Concentration

Concentration measures how much solute is present in a given volume of solution.

Chemical Equations

Chemical equations represent the reactants and products in a chemical reaction, showing their relationships.

EXAMPLES

- Calculating the number of moles in 10 grams of NaCl.
- Finding the molar mass of H₂O as 18 g/mol.
- Using stoichiometry to determine how much product forms from given reactants.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'Mole' as 'Mole-cules' to link to particles.
- ★ Use 'C' for Concentration and 'C' for 'Concentration' to recall its definition.
- ★ Think of 'Stoichiometry' as 'Stitching together' reactants and products.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing moles with grams without using molar mass.
- ✗ Neglecting to balance chemical equations before calculations.
- ✗ Misunderstanding concentration units, mixing up molarity and molality.
