DEFINITION

A set is a collection of distinct objects considered as a whole. Sets can contain numbers, letters, or other elements.

KEY CONCEPTS

Types of Sets

Sets can be finite, infinite, empty, or universal, each serving different purposes in mathematics.

Set Notation

Sets are usually represented by curly braces, e.g., $A = \{1, 2, 3\}$.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'U' for Union, like 'United' elements together.
- ★ Think of 'I' in Intersection as the common point.
- ★ Use 'S' for Subset, as a smaller 'S' inside a larger set.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing union with intersection.
- ✗ Not recognizing empty sets as valid.
- ✗ Miscounting elements in a set due to duplicates.
