DEFINITION

General Intelligence and Reasoning tests your ability to think logically and solve problems. It includes various types of questions that assess your analytical skills.

KEY CONCEPTS

Logical Reasoning

Involves drawing conclusions from premises or solving puzzles using deductive reasoning.

Verbal Reasoning

Focuses on understanding and reasoning using concepts framed in words, such as analogies and syllogisms.

Non-Verbal Reasoning

Includes visual and spatial reasoning tasks, such as pattern recognition and shape sequences.

Analytical Reasoning

Involves breaking down complex information into simpler parts to understand relationships.

Data Interpretation

Requires analyzing data presented in graphs or charts to draw conclusions or make decisions.

EXAMPLES

- If all cats are animals and some animals are dogs, are some cats dogs?
- Find the missing number in the series: 2, 4, 8, ?, 32.
- Identify the odd one out: Circle, Square, Triangle, Rectangle.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'VAN' for Verbal, Analytical, and Non-Verbal reasoning.
- ★ Visualize patterns in Non-Verbal questions to recall shapes easily.
- ★ Create a story around logical sequences to remember their order.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rushing through questions without reading them carefully.
- ✗ Misinterpreting data in charts and graphs.
- ✗ Ignoring negative statements in syllogisms.
