DEFINITION

General Intelligence and Reasoning tests your logical thinking and problem-solving abilities. It includes various types of questions that assess your analytical skills.

KEY CONCEPTS

Analogies

Finding relationships between pairs of words or phrases to solve problems.

Series Completion

Identifying patterns in sequences of numbers or letters to predict the next element.

Classification

Grouping items based on common characteristics to determine their relationships.

Syllogisms

Drawing logical conclusions from given statements to assess validity.

Direction Sense

Understanding and interpreting directions to solve location-based problems.

EXAMPLES

- Dog is to Bark as Cat is to Meow.
- What comes next in the series: 2, 4, 6, 8?
- All roses are flowers; some flowers are red. Therefore, some roses are red.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'A-S-C-D' for Analogies, Series, Classification, and Direction.
- ★ Visualize patterns in series completion to enhance recall.
- ★ Create a story linking syllogism statements for easier understanding.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rushing through questions without analyzing all options.
- ✗ Ignoring the keywords in syllogisms that change the meaning.
- ✗ Overlooking simple patterns in series due to complexity.
