DEFINITION

General Intelligence and Reasoning involves logical thinking and problem-solving skills. It assesses a candidate's ability to analyze and interpret information effectively.

KEY CONCEPTS

Analogy

Analogy questions require finding relationships between pairs of words or phrases.

Series Completion

This involves identifying patterns in a sequence of numbers or letters to predict the next element.

Classification

Classification questions ask you to group items based on shared characteristics.

Syllogism

Syllogism involves drawing conclusions from two or more premises, assessing logical relationships.

Direction Sense

These questions test your ability to determine directions based on given scenarios.

EXAMPLES

- Find the next number in the series: 2, 4, 8, 16, ?
- Which word does not belong: Apple, Banana, Carrot, Grape?
- If A is to the left of B and B is to the right of C, where is A?

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'A-S-C-D' to remember Analogy, Series, Classification, Direction.
- ★ Visualize patterns in series completion to enhance recall.
- ★ Create a story linking premises in syllogism for better understanding.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rushing through questions without analyzing all options.
- ✗ Misinterpreting the relationships in analogy questions.
- ✗ Overlooking direction clues in sense-based questions.
