DEFINITION

General Intelligence and Reasoning involves logical thinking and problem-solving skills. It tests your ability to analyze patterns, sequences, and relationships.

KEY CONCEPTS

Analogy

Analogy questions ask you to find relationships between pairs of words or phrases.

Series Completion

This involves identifying the next number or letter in a sequence based on a pattern.

Classification

Classification questions require you to group items based on shared characteristics.

Syllogism

Syllogism involves drawing logical conclusions from given statements.

Direction Sense

This tests your ability to understand and interpret directions and positions.

EXAMPLES

- Dog is to Bark as Cat is to Meow.
- What comes next in the series: 2, 4, 6, 8, ?
- Group: Apple, Banana, Carrot - Identify the odd one out.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'A-S-C-D' for Analogy, Series, Classification, Direction.
- ★ Visualize relationships in analogy questions to remember connections.
- ★ Practice with flashcards to reinforce key concepts and definitions.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rushing through questions without analyzing them carefully.
- ✗ Misinterpreting the relationships in analogy questions.
- ✗ Neglecting to review basic patterns in series completion.
