DEFINITION

General Intelligence and Reasoning involves logical thinking and problem-solving skills. It assesses your ability to analyze information and draw conclusions.

KEY CONCEPTS

Analogies

Identifying relationships between pairs of words or phrases to find similar pairs.

Series Completion

Finding the next number or term in a sequence based on a pattern.

Coding-Decoding

Interpreting coded messages by identifying the rules used for encoding.

Syllogisms

Drawing conclusions from two or more premises that are assumed to be true.

Blood Relations

Understanding relationships between family members based on given information.

EXAMPLES

- Dog is to Bark as Cat is to Meow.
- What comes next in the series: 2, 4, 6, 8?
- If A = 1, B = 2, what is C?

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'ACE' for Analogies, Coding, and Equivalence.
- ★ Visualize relationships in Blood Relations using a family tree.
- ★ Practice series completion with common patterns like +2, +3, etc.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rushing through questions without analyzing the options carefully.
- ✗ Overlooking simple patterns in series or analogies.
- ✗ Misinterpreting the relationships in blood relation questions.
