DEFINITION

General Ability in CAPF exams tests candidates' reasoning, analytical skills, and comprehension. It assesses both verbal and numerical aptitude essential for defence roles.

KEY CONCEPTS

Verbal Ability

Involves understanding and analyzing written information, including comprehension and vocabulary.

Numerical Ability

Focuses on mathematical skills, including basic arithmetic, percentages, and data interpretation.

Logical Reasoning

Tests the ability to think critically and solve problems using logic and patterns.

Data Interpretation

Involves analyzing graphs, charts, and tables to extract meaningful information.

General Awareness

Covers current events and general knowledge relevant to national and international affairs.

EXAMPLES

- Finding the average of a set of numbers.
- Interpreting a bar graph to answer questions.
- Solving a verbal analogy.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'VNDG' for Verbal, Numerical, Data, General to remember key areas.
- ★ Create flashcards for vocabulary words to enhance verbal skills.
- ★ Practice with mock tests to familiarize yourself with question formats.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Rushing through questions without reading them carefully.
- ✗ Neglecting to practice data interpretation skills.
- ✗ Overlooking basic mathematical concepts.
