DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Purpose of Documentation

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting to include authentication details in requests.
- ✗ Using incorrect request methods for specific actions.
- ✗ Failing to update documentation when API changes occur.
