DEFINITION

NestJS is a progressive Node.js framework for building efficient and scalable server-side applications. It uses TypeScript and leverages modern JavaScript features to enhance development productivity.

KEY CONCEPTS

Modules

Modules are the fundamental building blocks of a NestJS application, organizing related components.

Providers

Providers are classes that can be injected into controllers or other providers, encapsulating business logic.

Middleware

Middleware functions are executed during the request-response cycle, allowing for request modification or logging.

Controllers

Controllers handle incoming requests and return responses, defining the routes of the application.

Dependency Injection

NestJS uses dependency injection to manage class dependencies, promoting modularity and testability.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting to import modules in the main application module.
- ✗ Confusing controllers with providers and their responsibilities.
- ✗ Forgetting to define routes in controllers.
