DEFINITION

React Native is a framework for building mobile applications using JavaScript and React. It allows developers to create apps for both iOS and Android from a single codebase.

KEY CONCEPTS

Cross-Platform Development

React Native enables developers to write one codebase that works on multiple platforms, reducing development time.

Hot Reloading

This feature allows developers to see changes in real-time without losing the application state, speeding up the development process.

Styling

Styling in React Native is done using JavaScript objects, similar to CSS, but with some differences in syntax.

Components

React Native uses reusable components to build the user interface, making it modular and easy to manage.

Native Modules

React Native can access native device features through modules, allowing for enhanced functionality and performance.

- ✗ Neglecting to test on both iOS and Android devices.
- ✗ Overusing state, leading to performance issues.
- ✗ Ignoring the importance of proper styling and layout.
