DEFINITION

Ethical hacking involves legally probing systems for vulnerabilities to improve security. It helps organizations protect their data and infrastructure from malicious attacks.

KEY CONCEPTS

Types of Hackers

Hackers are categorized into white hats (ethical), black hats (malicious), and gray hats (mixed motives).

Penetration Testing

This is a simulated cyber attack to identify and fix security weaknesses in systems.

Vulnerability Assessment

A systematic review of security weaknesses in an information system to prioritize remediation.

Legal and Ethical Standards

Ethical hackers must operate within legal boundaries and follow ethical guidelines to ensure trust.

Tools and Techniques

Common tools include Nmap, Metasploit, and Wireshark for scanning and analyzing networks.

EXAMPLES

- Using Nmap to scan a network for open ports.
- Conducting a penetration test on a web application.
- Performing a vulnerability assessment on a company's infrastructure.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember the hacker types: White = Good, Black = Bad, Gray = Both.
- ★ Use the acronym PVT (Penetration, Vulnerability, Testing) to recall key processes.
- ★ Visualize a lock and key: Ethical hackers find the 'key' to unlock security flaws.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Assuming all hackers have malicious intent.
- ✗ Neglecting legal implications of hacking activities.
- ✗ Overlooking the importance of documentation during assessments.
