DEFINITION

Angular is a platform and framework for building single-page web applications using HTML and TypeScript. It allows developers to create rich, interactive user interfaces efficiently.

KEY CONCEPTS

Components

Components are the building blocks of Angular applications, encapsulating HTML, CSS, and logic.

Services

Services are reusable pieces of code that provide specific functionality, often used for data management.

Routing

Routing enables navigation between different views or components in a single-page application.

Modules

Modules are containers for a cohesive block of code dedicated to an application domain, helping to organize the app.

Dependency Injection

Dependency Injection is a design pattern that allows Angular to manage service instances and their dependencies automatically.

EXAMPLES

- Creating a simple user profile component.
- Setting up a service to fetch data from an API.
- Implementing routing to navigate between home and about pages.

- ★ Remember 'C-M-S-R' for Components, Modules, Services, Routing.
- ★ Think of Angular as a 'toolbox' for building web apps.
- ★ Visualize components as 'LEGO blocks' that fit together to form an app.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting to declare components in the appropriate module.
- ✗ Forgetting to inject services in the constructor.
- ✗ Misconfiguring routing paths, leading to navigation errors.
