DEFINITION

React is a JavaScript library for building dynamic user interfaces. It allows developers to create reusable UI components efficiently.

KEY CONCEPTS

Components

Components are the building blocks of a React application, encapsulating UI and behavior.

State Management

State is an object that determines how a component behaves and renders. It can change over time.

Lifecycle Methods

Lifecycle methods are hooks that allow you to run code at specific points in a component's life.

JSX

JSX is a syntax extension that allows writing HTML-like code within JavaScript, making it easier to create components.

Props

Props are inputs to components, allowing data to be passed from one component to another.

EXAMPLES

- Creating a button component that updates a counter.
- Building a form that captures user input and displays it.
- Rendering a list of items dynamically from an array.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'C' for Components, 'J' for JSX, 'S' for State, 'P' for Props.
- ★ Think of React as a 'REusable ACTor' for UI components.
- ★ Use the acronym 'LPS' for Lifecycle, Props, State to recall key concepts.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Forgetting to use 'key' props in lists, leading to performance issues.
- ✗ Mutating state directly instead of using `setState`.
- ✗ Not using components properly, leading to unorganized code.
