- ★ Remember 'LEMON' for Logging, Evaluation, Monitoring, Observations, and Notifications.
- ★ Think of 'RAMP' for Rollback, Assess, Monitor, and Prioritize.
- ★ Use 'FIND' for Find issues, Investigate, Note impact, and Debug.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting to log errors, making it hard to trace issues.
- ✗ Failing to communicate with users about known issues.
- ✗ Rushing fixes without proper testing, leading to new bugs.
