DEFINITION

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'ICE' for Identify, Communicate, Engage.
- ★ Visualize a web where each stakeholder is a node connected to the project.
- ★ Remember 'A-C-E' for Analyze, Communicate, Evaluate to recall key steps.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting to identify all relevant stakeholders early in the project.
- ✗ Failing to tailor communication methods to different stakeholder needs.
- ✗ Ignoring stakeholder feedback, leading to dissatisfaction and project issues.
