DEFINITION

SQL, or Structured Query Language, is a standard programming language used to manage and manipulate relational databases. It allows users to create, read, update, and delete data efficiently.

KEY CONCEPTS

Database

A structured collection of data that can be easily accessed and managed.

Table

A set of data organized in rows and columns, similar to a spreadsheet.

Query

A request for data or information from a database, typically written in SQL.

CRUD Operations

The four basic functions of persistent storage: Create, Read, Update, and Delete.

Primary Key

A unique identifier for each record in a table, ensuring data integrity.

EXAMPLES

- `SELECT * FROM students;`
- `INSERT INTO courses (name, credits) VALUES ('Math', 3);`
- `DELETE FROM teachers WHERE id = 5;`

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember CRUD: Create, Read, Update, Delete.
- ★ Think of SQL as a 'structured' way to 'query' data.
- ★ Visualize tables like spreadsheets for easier understanding.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Forgetting to end queries with a semicolon.
- ✗ Confusing WHERE and HAVING clauses.
- ✗ Not using single quotes for string values.
