Introduction to Salesforce DevOps

DEFINITION

Salesforce DevOps is a set of practices that combine software development and IT operations for Salesforce applications. It aims to improve collaboration, automate processes, and enhance the speed of delivering updates.

KEY CONCEPTS

Continuous Integration

A practice where code changes are automatically tested and merged into a shared repository.

Continuous Delivery

The ability to deploy code changes to production at any time, ensuring software is always ready for release.

Version Control

A system that tracks changes to code, allowing teams to collaborate and manage code versions effectively.

Automated Testing

Using scripts to automatically test code, ensuring that new changes do not break existing functionality.

Release Management

The process of planning, scheduling, and controlling software builds and deployments.

EXAMPLES

- Using Git for version control in Salesforce projects.
- Setting up CI/CD pipelines with tools like Jenkins.
- Automating tests with Salesforce's built-in testing framework.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'CI/CD' as 'Continuous Improvement/Continuous Deployment'.
- ★ Think of 'Version Control' as a library for your code.
- ★ Associate 'Automated Testing' with a robot checking your homework.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting to document changes in version control.
- ✗ Skipping automated tests before deployment.
- ✗ Underestimating the importance of collaboration in teams.
