DEFINITION

Descriptive writing uses vivid details to create strong images in the reader's mind. It helps readers experience what you are describing through their senses.

KEY CONCEPTS

Sensory Details

Use sight, sound, smell, taste, and touch to make descriptions come alive.

Figurative Language

Incorporate similes, metaphors, and personification to enhance descriptions.

Organized Structure

Arrange descriptions logically, often moving from general to specific details.

Show, Don't Tell

Instead of stating facts, illustrate them with examples and imagery.

Strong Adjectives

Choose precise and powerful adjectives to create vivid images.

EXAMPLES

- The sun set like a fiery orange ball sinking into the ocean.
- The old tree creaked and groaned, its gnarled branches reaching out like fingers.
- The chocolate cake was rich, moist, and topped with a glossy, dark ganache.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember '5 Senses' to recall sensory details.
- ★ Use 'Show, Don't Tell' as a guiding mantra.
- ★ Think 'Adjectives are your friends' to remember to use strong descriptive words.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Using vague or generic adjectives instead of specific ones.
- ✗ Overloading descriptions with too many details, making it confusing.
- ✗ Neglecting to engage the reader's senses.
