DEFINITION

- Correcting 'I seen the movie yesterday' to 'I saw the movie yesterday.'

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym P.E.C.W.C. for Proofreading, Editing, Clarity, Word choice, Consistency.
- ★ Remember 'Edit to Elevate' to think of editing as a way to improve your writing.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Skipping proofreading altogether before submitting work.
- ✗ Ignoring feedback from peers or teachers.
- ✗ Overlooking small errors like typos or missing punctuation.
