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What is Adverbs

DEFINITION

Adverbs are words that describe or modify verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs. They tell us how, when, where, or to what extent something happens.

KEY CONCEPTS

Types of Adverbs

Adverbs can be categorized into several types, including adverbs of manner, time, place, and degree.

Adverbs of Time

These adverbs tell us when something happens, like 'yesterday' or 'soon.'

Adverbs of Degree

These adverbs express the intensity or degree of an action or adjective, like 'very' or 'quite.'

Adverbs of Manner

These adverbs describe how an action is performed, such as 'quickly' or 'carefully.'

Adverbs of Place

These adverbs indicate where an action occurs, such as 'here' or 'everywhere.'

EXAMPLES

- She runs quickly.
- He will arrive tomorrow.
- The cat is hiding somewhere.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'ly' often means it's an adverb, like 'happily' or 'slowly.'
- ★ Think of adverbs as 'action helpers' that add detail to verbs.
- ★ Use the acronym 'W-H-E-D' to recall: When, How, Everywhere, Degree.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing adverbs with adjectives, like saying 'She sings beautiful' instead of 'beautifully.'
- ✗ Using adverbs in the wrong place in a sentence.
- ✗ Overusing adverbs instead of strong verbs, like saying 'He ran quickly' instead of 'He sprinted.'
