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What is Fairness

Fairness means treating everyone equally and justly.

DEFINITION

Fairness is about giving everyone the same opportunities and being honest. It means making sure that rules apply to all and that everyone is respected.

KEY CONCEPTS

Equality

Everyone should have the same rights and chances, regardless of differences.

Justice

Making decisions that are right and fair, based on facts and rules.

Impartiality

Not favoring one person over another; being unbiased in decisions.

Respect

Valuing others' feelings and opinions, treating them with dignity.

Sharing

Dividing resources or opportunities so that everyone benefits equally.

EXAMPLES

- Sharing toys equally during playtime.
- Taking turns in a game without favoritism.
- Listening to everyone's opinion before making a group decision.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Think of 'fair' as 'fair share' to remember sharing equally.
- ★ Use the acronym E.J.I.R. (Equality, Justice, Impartiality, Respect) to recall key concepts.
- ★ Visualize a balanced scale to remember fairness means balance.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Assuming fairness means everyone gets the same thing, rather than what they need.
- ✗ Ignoring others' feelings when making decisions.
- ✗ Confusing fairness with favoritism or bias.

QUICK RECAP
