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What is Beginning Sounds

DEFINITION

Beginning sounds are the first sounds in words. They help us identify and read words more easily.

KEY CONCEPTS

Phoneme

A phoneme is the smallest unit of sound in a word.

Initial Sound

The initial sound is the first sound you hear when a word is spoken.

Sound Recognition

Recognizing beginning sounds helps with reading and spelling words.

Sound Matching

Sound matching involves finding words that start with the same sound.

Blending Sounds

Blending sounds means putting together different sounds to form words.

EXAMPLES

- Cat starts with /k/
- Dog starts with /d/
- Fish starts with /f/

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Think of the first letter as the first sound.
- ★ Use alliteration: 'Silly snakes slide.'
- ★ Create a sound chart with pictures.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing similar sounds, like /b/ and /p/
- ✗ Not pronouncing the first sound clearly.
- ✗ Ignoring silent letters in words.
