DEFINITION

- ★ Visualize a relay race to think about passing the speaking baton.
- ★ Use the acronym 'PRACTICE' to recall the importance of practice in group settings.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Not practicing together enough before the presentation.
- ✗ Failing to assign clear roles to each speaker.
- ✗ Interrupting each other instead of smoothly transitioning.
