DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Structure

Emotion

Using feelings helps the audience relate to the story and remember it better.

Imagery

Descriptive language paints pictures in the audience's mind, making the story come alive.

Delivery

How you tell the story, including voice and body language, affects its impact.

Audience Engagement

Connecting with the audience through questions or eye contact keeps them interested.

EXAMPLES

- Sharing a personal experience about a family trip.
- Telling a fable with a moral lesson.
- Narrating a historical event with vivid details.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym S.E.I.D.E. for Structure, Emotion, Imagery, Delivery, Engagement.
- ★ Visualize your story as a movie to remember key scenes.
- ★ Practice storytelling with friends to reinforce memory through repetition.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Reading directly from notes instead of engaging with the audience.
- ✗ Rushing through the story without pauses for effect.
- ✗ Neglecting to practice the speech beforehand.
