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# What is Non-Living Things

Discover the World of Non-Living Things!

DEFINITION

Non-living things are objects that do not grow, reproduce, or need food. They can be natural or man-made.

KEY CONCEPTS

Natural Non-Living Things

These are found in nature, like rocks, water, and air.

Man-Made Non-Living Things

These are created by people, such as toys, buildings, and cars.

Characteristics

Non-living things do not have life; they do not breathe or move on their own.

Importance

Non-living things are essential for our daily lives, providing tools and materials.

Difference from Living Things

Unlike living things, non-living things do not grow or change on their own.

EXAMPLES

- A rock on the ground
- A plastic bottle
- A wooden chair

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember: Non-living = No life!
- ★ Think of 'N' for Non-living as 'No growth'.
- ★ Use the acronym 'MAN' for Man-made Non-living things.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing non-living things with plants or animals.
- ✗ Thinking all objects in nature are living.
- ✗ Not recognizing man-made items as non-living.
