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What is Science Experiments

DEFINITION

Science experiments are hands-on activities that help us learn about the world. They involve testing ideas to see what happens and understanding the results.

KEY CONCEPTS

Hypothesis

A hypothesis is an educated guess about what you think will happen in an experiment.

Variables

Variables are the factors that can change in an experiment, like temperature or time.

Procedure

The procedure is a step-by-step guide on how to conduct the experiment.

Observation

Observation involves watching and noting what happens during the experiment.

Conclusion

The conclusion summarizes what you learned from the experiment and whether your hypothesis was correct.

EXAMPLES

- Mix vinegar and baking soda to see a chemical reaction.
- Plant seeds in different soils to test growth rates.
- Create a simple circuit with a battery and a bulb.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'HVP' for Hypothesis, Variables, Procedure.
- ★ Use 'OCC' for Observation, Conclusion, and Communication.
- ★ Think of 'Experiment = Explore' to connect learning with fun.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Not changing only one variable at a time.
- ✗ Skipping the observation step.
- ✗ Not writing down results clearly.
