

What is Story Retelling

Master the Art of Story Retelling!

DEFINITION

Story retelling is when you share a story in your own words. It helps you understand and remember the story better.

KEY CONCEPTS

Main Idea

Identify the central theme or message of the story.

Characters

Know who the main characters are and their roles in the story.

Plot Structure

Understand the beginning, middle, and end of the story.

Details

Include important events and descriptions that support the main idea.

Personal Touch

Add your own thoughts or feelings about the story to make it unique.

EXAMPLES

- Retell 'The Three Little Pigs' focusing on each pig's house.
- Summarize 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' by describing Goldilocks' actions.
- Share 'Cinderella' by highlighting her transformation and the ball.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Use the acronym 'MCPD' for Main idea, Characters, Plot, Details.
- ★ Visualize the story as a movie in your mind.
- ★ Create a story map to organize events and characters.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Forgetting key details or characters.
- ✗ Retelling too much or too little of the story.
- ✗ Not using your own words and copying the original text.

QUICK RECAP
