Punctuation: The Key to Clear Writing!

DEFINITION

Punctuation marks are symbols that help organize and clarify writing. They guide readers on how to read sentences correctly.

KEY CONCEPTS

Periods

Periods mark the end of a statement or command.

Commas

Commas separate items in a list or indicate a pause in a sentence.

Question Marks

Question marks signal that a sentence is asking something.

Exclamation Points

Exclamation points show strong feelings or excitement.

Quotation Marks

Quotation marks enclose spoken words or direct quotes.

EXAMPLES

- I love ice cream.
- Do you want pizza?
- Wow! That's amazing!

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Think of punctuation as traffic signs for sentences.
- ★ Remember: periods stop, commas pause.
- ★ Exclamation points are like fireworks—full of excitement!

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Forgetting to use commas in lists.
- ✗ Using periods instead of question marks.
- ✗ Overusing exclamation points in formal writing.
