- ★ Use flashcards for vocabulary; visualize each word in context.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Mixing up similar-looking letters.
- ✗ Incorrectly placing vowel diacritics.
- ✗ Forgetting to follow the Subject-Object-Verb order.
