DEFINITION

Chinese characters are the written symbols used in Mandarin. Each character represents a meaning or a sound, making them essential for reading and writing in Chinese.

KEY CONCEPTS

Pictographs

- ✗ Mispronouncing tones, altering the meaning of words.
