DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Vowel Harmony

- ★ Use the phrase 'long sounds last longer' to recall the importance of sound length.
- ★ Associate stress on the first syllable with 'first is best' to remember Finnish stress patterns.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing short and long vowels, which can change word meanings.
- ✗ Mispronouncing consonant gradation, leading to incorrect forms of words.
- ✗ Ignoring vowel harmony rules, resulting in unnatural-sounding words.
