DEFINITION

French grammar involves the rules that govern how words are used in sentences. Understanding these rules helps you communicate clearly in French.

KEY CONCEPTS

Nouns and Articles

Nouns are words for people, places, or things, and articles define them as specific or general.

Verbs and Conjugation

Verbs express actions and must be conjugated to match the subject and tense.

Adjectives Agreement

Adjectives describe nouns and must agree in gender and number with the nouns they modify.

Subject Pronouns

Subject pronouns replace nouns and indicate who is performing the action in a sentence.

Basic Sentence Structure

French sentences typically follow a Subject-Verb-Object order, similar to English.

EXAMPLES

- Le chat est noir. (The cat is black.)
- Nous mangeons des pommes. (We eat apples.)
- Elle aime le chocolat. (She loves chocolate.)

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'la' for feminine and 'le' for masculine nouns.
- ★ Use the acronym 'SVOMPT' to remember Subject, Verb, Object, Modifier, Pronoun, Tense.
- ★ Visualize a matching game for adjectives and nouns to reinforce agreement.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Mixing up gendered articles (le vs. la).
- ✗ Incorrect verb conjugations based on the subject.
- ✗ Forgetting to match adjectives with nouns in gender and number.
