DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

- ★ Use the acronym V-S-O for 'Verb-Subject-Object' to recall sentence structure.
- ★ Think of 'Adjective Agreement' as 'Adjectives Align' with nouns.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing noun cases and using the wrong form.
- ✗ Incorrect verb conjugation based on the subject.
- ✗ Neglecting adjective agreement with nouns.
