DEFINITION

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing similar-sounding words, like 'neko' (cat) and 'niko' (smile).
- ✗ Mispronouncing vowel sounds, which can change meanings.
- ✗ Forgetting to use particles like 'wa' or 'ga' in sentences.
