DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Nouns and Pronouns

- Man ketab ra mikhanam. (I read the book.)
- An dokhtar khub ast. (That girl is good.)
- Dar khaneh hastam. (I am at home.)

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember SOV: Subject-Object-Verb for sentence order.
- ★ Link verbs with their endings to remember tenses.
- ★ Visualize nouns with their corresponding pronouns for easier recall.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing verb tenses, especially past and present.
- ✗ Mixing up noun genders and their corresponding adjectives.
- ✗ Using incorrect prepositions in sentences.
