- ★ Practice with a partner to enhance recall through repetition.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Neglecting facial expressions, which are essential in ASL.
- ✗ Forgetting to use space effectively when signing.
- ✗ Relying too much on fingerspelling instead of using signs.
