DEFINITION

ASL vocabulary consists of signs used to express words and ideas in American Sign Language. Learning these signs helps in basic conversations and understanding others.

KEY CONCEPTS

Finger Spelling

Using the manual alphabet to spell out words letter by letter.

Common Signs

Basic signs like 'hello', 'thank you', and 'please' that are frequently used.

Facial Expressions

Important for conveying emotions and grammatical information in ASL.

Contextual Usage

Understanding how signs change meaning based on the context of conversation.

Repetition Practice

Regularly practicing signs to reinforce memory and improve fluency.

EXAMPLES

- Sign 'hello' by waving your hand.
- Use finger spelling for 'cat' as C-A-T.
- Show 'thank you' by moving your fingers from your chin outward.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Associate signs with images or actions that represent their meaning.
- ★ Create a story using signs to link them together in your mind.
- ★ Practice with a partner to reinforce learning through interaction.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing similar signs, like 'more' and 'eat'.
- ✗ Neglecting facial expressions which are crucial for meaning.
- ✗ Forgetting to use finger spelling for proper nouns.
