DEFINITION

Directions help you navigate places by telling you where to go. Learning key phrases can make traveling smoother.

KEY CONCEPTS

Asking for Directions

Use phrases like 'Excuse me, where is...?' to get help finding places.

Landmarks

Use well-known places like 'the park' or 'the bank' to make directions clearer.

Transportation Vocabulary

Know terms like 'bus stop', 'train station', and 'taxi' for easier travel.

Giving Directions

Learn to use simple commands like 'turn left' or 'go straight' to guide others.

Distance Indicators

Words like 'near', 'far', and 'a block away' help describe how far to go.

EXAMPLES

- Excuse me, where is the nearest bus stop?
- Go straight for two blocks, then turn right.
- Is the hotel far from here?

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'L' for left and 'R' for right to avoid confusion.
- ★ Visualize a map in your mind when practicing directions.
- ★ Associate landmarks with directions to create memorable routes.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Confusing left and right when giving directions.
- ✗ Using complex phrases instead of simple commands.
- ✗ Not asking for clarification if directions are unclear.
