DEFINITION

KEY CONCEPTS

Focal Points

Balance

Scale and Proportion

Layering

- ★ Visualize a mountain range to recall layering and texture variation.
- ★ Think of a balanced diet to remember the importance of balance in design.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Overcrowding the tank with too many hardscape elements.
- ✗ Ignoring the scale of materials in relation to tank size.
- ✗ Neglecting to create a focal point, resulting in a flat design.
