DEFINITION

- ★ Think '3s' for grouping elements: use threes for rocks and plants.
- ★ Visualize a triangle for balance in plant placement.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Overcrowding the tank with too many plants or decorations.
- ✗ Neglecting the height variation, leading to a flat appearance.
- ✗ Ignoring the importance of lighting and its effect on plant growth.
