- Use a lunar map to locate Tycho crater.
- Track the Moon's position over several nights.

MEMORY TIPS

- ★ Remember 'New, Waxing, Full, Waning' for lunar phases.
- ★ Think of 'Seas' as dark areas on the Moon's surface.
- ★ Use the acronym 'TLC' for Telescope, Lunar features, and Clear skies.

COMMON MISTAKES

- ✗ Not checking the Moon phase before observing.
- ✗ Using a telescope without understanding its settings.
- ✗ Ignoring weather conditions that affect visibility.
